ELECTION 2011

This year the Monroe County Conservative Party has endorsed 114 well-qualified and Conservatively oriented candidates for local public offices (list on front page).

We have supported five County-wide candidates. The re-election of Maggie Brooks will be a high priority this year. Since 2004, our County Executive has been a hard-working, professional, Conservatively oriented administrator. The property tax rate this year is lower than when she took office. Her 2011 Budget keeps discretionary spending below the rate of inflation. This without cutting services! For Maggie it has always been: ALL ABOUT JOBS (She has helped to create or save over 80,000 jobs!). Maggie was a prophet and a genius on Medicaid (government healthcare for the poor). In 2007, Monroe County was the only one of 62 Counties which tied Medicaid solely to the sales tax receipts. This saved our taxpayers at least \$40 million. Under Maggie our County Government has become smaller, smarter, and more efficient. Maggie's opponent is a habitual tax raiser. Her campaign has been an embarrassment. She and her ally, the Democrat and Chronicle, (which is incompetent and very biased) are obsessed with irrelevant, petty, out-dated issues which will not matter to the voters this November. The politically motivated Albany audits are unfair and based on rumors. Maggie, based on her professional and Conservative record, should win easily in November.

There are three County-wide Judicial races this year. The Monroe County Conservative Party has a 32 year tradition of endorsing and helping to elect "the very best" Judicial candidates. Judge Gino Nitti is running for County Court. He is a good candidate. We have two excellent candidates for State Supreme Court: Justice Nancy Smith and Tom Moran.

All 29 Monroe County Legislators, under the new lines, are up for election this year. The Democratic Legislators are controlled by the "Radical Liberal" City Legislators. Their policies are not in the best interest of the citizens of Monroe County. One half of the local town offices are up for election this year (Supervisor, Town Board, Town Judge, etc.) They are the electoral, hard working, Conservatively oriented, grass roots of politics in Monroe County. We have an excellent relationship with our endorsed local public officials.

We have Row C back, and we will be

the "margin of victory" in many electoral contests this year. The Monroe County Conservative Party will play a constructive and pivotal role for the benefit of our citizens in election 2011.

A GREAT NEW NON-PARTISAN D.A.!

The key and perhaps most competitive election contest this year will be the race for Monroe County District Attorney. Current D.A., Democrat Mike Green is not running for re-election. It is the duty of the top local prosecutor to protect our citizens and to pursue the elusive concept known as "justice". The D.A. has awesome power. He or she can indict a ham sandwich (Mr. Smith or Mr. Moore) or let a vicious murderer go free. Therefore, it is essential that the top local prosecutor has experience, judgment, character, and appropriate discretion. That is why the Monroe County Conservative Party and the D.A.'s Law Enforcement partners [the police and many former Assistant District Attorney's (F.A.D.A.) enthusiastically support conservative- Republican Bill Taylor.

This year's Special Election victory by Kathy Hochul in the 26th Congressional District means that Congresswoman Louise Slaughter (28th C.D.) will be defeated in her re-election bid next year. Senator Alesi Commits “CRIMINAL TRESPASS.” THEN, HE SUES!

On January 19, 2008, State Senator James Alesi, and a female friend, approached the premises known as 15 Conover Crossing in the Town of Perinton. Said premises was private property owned by John C. Hecker, Jr. and Janet N. Hecker. It was purchased by them on October 25, 2007. It was not a construction “model”. There were no signs indicating it was anything other than a private residence. Alesi tried the front door which was locked. Then, he went behind the house, pushed open the unlocked basement door, and entered. The Heckers’ were not present. Thereafter, Alesi injured himself inside the house.

Alesi was a trespasser. He was not an invitee or a licensee. The Monroe County Sheriff’s Department police report indicates that Alesi was obviously illegally in the house. (See Penal Law section 140.15 and/or Penal Law section 140.10- Criminal Trespass 3rd and/or Criminal Trespass 2nd.) The Heckers’, an elderly couple and Alesi’s constituents, were given their options by the Sheriff’s Department. The police recommended that they file criminal charges against Alesi. However, the Heckers’ being nice and forgiving people, gave Alesi a break by not charging him with Criminal Trespass.

The Statute of Limitations for Criminal Trespass is 3 years. It is also 3 years for negligence. Therefore, on January 18, 2011, Alesi, knowing he was no longer effectively liable for his illegal action, sued Mr. & Mrs. Hecker, in State Supreme Court, for alleged negligence (Alesi vs. Hecker, et. al). The action consisted of a six page Summons and Complaint. The lawsuit caused the Heckers’ much undeserved humiliation, publicity, embarrassment, and pain. Alesi illegally entered a private house, injured himself, and his lawsuit attempted to blame the completely innocent homeowners for his illegal conduct?

Alesi’s ridiculous legal action became a National scandal (Fox News, etc.)! Local Republican Chairman, William Reilich, said he was “outraged” by the lawsuit. It was “unacceptable”. He said Alesi should “apologize”. County Executive Maggie Brooks severely criticized Alesi for his actions. Alesi was mocked and held up to ridicule for his bizarre, insulting, and unfair lawsuit. Based upon the above, it is clear that State Senator James Alesi does not have the judgment, stability, or integrity to continue to represent us as our State Legislator.

WHY DID SENATOR ALESI VOTE FOR GAY MARRIAGE?

Senator Jim Alesi voted against Gay Marriage on December 2, 2009. A clear majority of his fellow Republican State Senators opposed the 2011 Bill on Same Sex Marriage. Most, if not all, of Alesi’s fellow elected Republicans in Monroe County are against Gay Marriage. Every poll and every public referendum, indicated that the public is against Same Sex Marriage. Until shortly before the 2011 vote, Alesi had never spoken in favor of Gay Marriage. On June 24, 2011, Alesi voted for the Gay Marriage Bill. Why? Alesi’s drastic conversion apparently happened at this year’s Memorial Day parade in East Rochester. As the County and Town officials marched, they received enthusiastic applause from the spectators. When Alesi marched by, there was initially silence by the individuals along the parade route. Some spectators glared at Alesi, others looked at the ground. Then, an individual yelled: “Hey Jimmy, I left my house unlocked. Why don’t you go and break into it. Then you can sue me.” The crowd laughed and cheered. Then, they booed Alesi. At that moment, Alesi realized he desperately needed new friends and new financial supporters if he was to get re-elected.

Alesi very much enjoys being a Senator. He loves the publicity and the power. Because of his ridiculous lawsuit, Alesi knew on Memorial Day that he would lose his re-election unless he did something dramatic. Therefore, he then decided to support Gay Marriage. He would run for re-election either as a hero or as a martyr and with his new friends and new contributors he thought he could be re-elected next year.

In the January 2011 periodic report summary, Alesi listed \$5,350 as total receipts. In the July periodic report, after his Gay Marriage vote, Alesi listed total receipts of \$149,575. His contributions were from The Empire State Pride Agenda, the gay rights group Gill Foundation, from gay hedge fund millionaires and billionaires and from other individual gay and lesbian contributors.
