### Random thoughts on political issues in Monroe County, Albany and Washington

This year we will be running **Radio Ads**, for our candidates and our philosophy, two weeks before the election (Nov. 5th). / **The Conservative Dinner** was held on May 10, 2019. The Keynote Speaker was Maria Walls, she was interesting. The Roger J. Robach Conservative of the Year was awarded to Supreme Court Justice Brett Kavanaugh (in absentia). Many Democrats and the media should be ashamed of themselves for their wrongful smear of Justice Kavanaugh. / This year "Team Conservative" had **42 Petition Passers** obtain over 700 signatures to put our 116 very good candidates on our ballot line: Row C. / **President Trump** is doing a very good job. On almost all the relevant issues he has been successful using common core Conservatism. One would only ask his political enemies (Democrats, the Media, Liberals, etc) to see he is winning! Trump Derangement Syndrome. They hate him for his successes. / **Voter Turnout** is important this year. There are 63,000 more Democrats in Monroe County than Registered Republicans. Last year on Row C our top candidate received 21,184 votes. This year voter turnout will be high and it will be even higher next year (Presidential year). / **The Sanctuary Cities** issue is ludicrous! Our Constitution does not allow local officials to ignore Federal Law. What if Alabama did not enforce Federal Civil Rights laws? President Trump should act aggressively against Sanctuary governments. / **Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (A.O.C.) and "the squad"** (Ilhan Omar, Ayanna Pressley, Rashida Tlaib) are the voices of the new wacko National Democrats. They are members of the Democratic Socialists of America. Their liberal agenda is contrary to our American values. They are very anti-Semitic. They believe in Medicare for all, a "Green New Deal", abolishing I.C.E., higher taxes, and many "free" programs. Their policy position, since they are illogical, and contrary to our Conservative philosophy, in the long run will probably lead to more Conservative votes

by the electorate. / **Martin Luther King, Jr's** theme was "I have a dream, that my children will one day live in a Nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character." Hopefully, Monroe County politics can return to a meritocracy and not select and elect unqualified candidates because of their skin color (Family Court last year). / **The Democrat and Chronicle** is no longer a viable daily newspaper. They have no political reporter. They cling to the corporate policy of its "all-American contest" (favor minorities at the expense of others). However, their obituaries are rather good! / Governor Cuomo and the State Legislature have passed a **Fusion Voting Bill** which may lead to the elimination of the New York Conservative Party. We advanced \$5,000 to have a lawsuit defeat said bill. So far, despite a promise, the NY State Conservative Party has declined to reimburse us for said fee. We are still waiting! / **The Law and a bipartisan Board of Elections** ruled that Supreme Court Convention Minutes must be filed within 72 hours of its convention. The Democrats admitted that they didn't do so because of their "incompetence." An unelected partisan Albany judge improperly returned the Democrat to the ballot. / With the defeat of the **Republican Majority in the State Senate** last year, New York has become the most liberal state in the nation. This is not good for our New York citizens! / On September 21, 2019, **Tom Cook** was unanimously re-elected Chairman of the Monroe County Conservative Party (21st term). He said, "during my Chairmanship I have met hundreds of great people. In the future, I look forward to advancing the Conservative philosophy and our good candidates."

## WHERE WE STAND

The New York State Conservative Party is the only legally recognized Conservative Party in the nation. This is because New York allows cross-party endorsements of candidates by all political parties. Unlike other political parties, the Conservative Party stands for precise positions on the relevant issues of the day. Most of our enrolled Conservative,

and endorsed candidates, support many of our beliefs of: lower taxes, less government, life, public safety, the 2nd Amendment, a meritocracy, public safety, a strong military, patriotism, hard work, individual initiative, and fiscal sanity. Also, we support and practice election honesty. We have little patronage, we do not accept a \$20,000

payment for our endorsement. (Livingston County). We oppose reverse discrimination and the incompetence and unfair bias of the **Democrat and Chronicle**. At this critical and pivotal time in our nation's history, America and our community needs and deserves the implementation of our common sense Conservative philosophy.

## ELECTION 2019 AND BEYOND!

At the beginning of this year it looked like a Democratic election tidal wave. Things have changed. Bill Napier took over as Monroe County Republican Chairman and has a "hands-on approach." He is an activist! He goes to events. The results of the Democratic inspired 3rd party primary challenges in the Monroe County Legislature were good for our endorsed candidates. County Executive Cheryl Dinolfo, after her Independence Primary victory, has a good chance to win reelection. Cheryl shares most of our Conservative values. She has worked with local, national and global employers to secure more than 20,000 jobs. She has secured bi-partisan support for an award-winning Airport and Zoo projects.

Cheryl has cut the property tax rate and restored the County's tax rate to all "A's". She is working very hard for the citizens of Monroe County. Our endorsed District Attorney Sandra Doorley is rightly described as "tough as nails, with compassion." She has severely limited plea bargaining, especially for violent crimes and DWIs. Most of her Assistant District Attorneys are first-rate professionals with experience and judgment. In her job, for the last eight years, she obviously prioritizes public safety. Sandra is hardworking and honest. We are proud of her! Many statewide knowledgeable political observers consider the Judges of Monroe County among the best in New York State. Our

four endorsed Judicial candidates, Justice Rosenbaum, Kevin Nasca, Judge John DeMarco and Kyle Steinebach are great candidates and are or will be wonderful Judges. The Republican majority in the Monroe County Legislature is very important for our citizens. They (listed on page 1) support our beliefs. If the Democrats control the Legislature they will prioritize policies that favor the city of Rochester. Of our 116 local endorsed candidates the vast majority will win. Next year, there will be 5 important countywide Judicial contests; we will endorse a "super team" of judges or soon to be judges. Also, next year there will be State and Federal races with many new candidates.

## ROCHESTER VOTER TURNOUT: A POTENTIAL PROBLEM!

There are several election contests this year that could be close. A factor in the electoral results will be the Rochester voter turnout. There are currently 66,615 registered Democrats in the city. There are only 10,085 enrolled Republicans in Rochester. The referendum this year deals with "public safety" (a police civilian review board). An emotional issue for most Rochester residents. Usually Rochester voter

turnout is around 30%, except for Presidential years and last year (55%), a Gubernatorial year. Some political analysts see Rochester voter turnout this year over 70%. The average Democratic candidate over the last year has won the city by a 4.5 to 1 margin. This year the Supreme Court races, the District Attorney and the County Court contests could be decided adversely by a high Rochester voter turnout.
